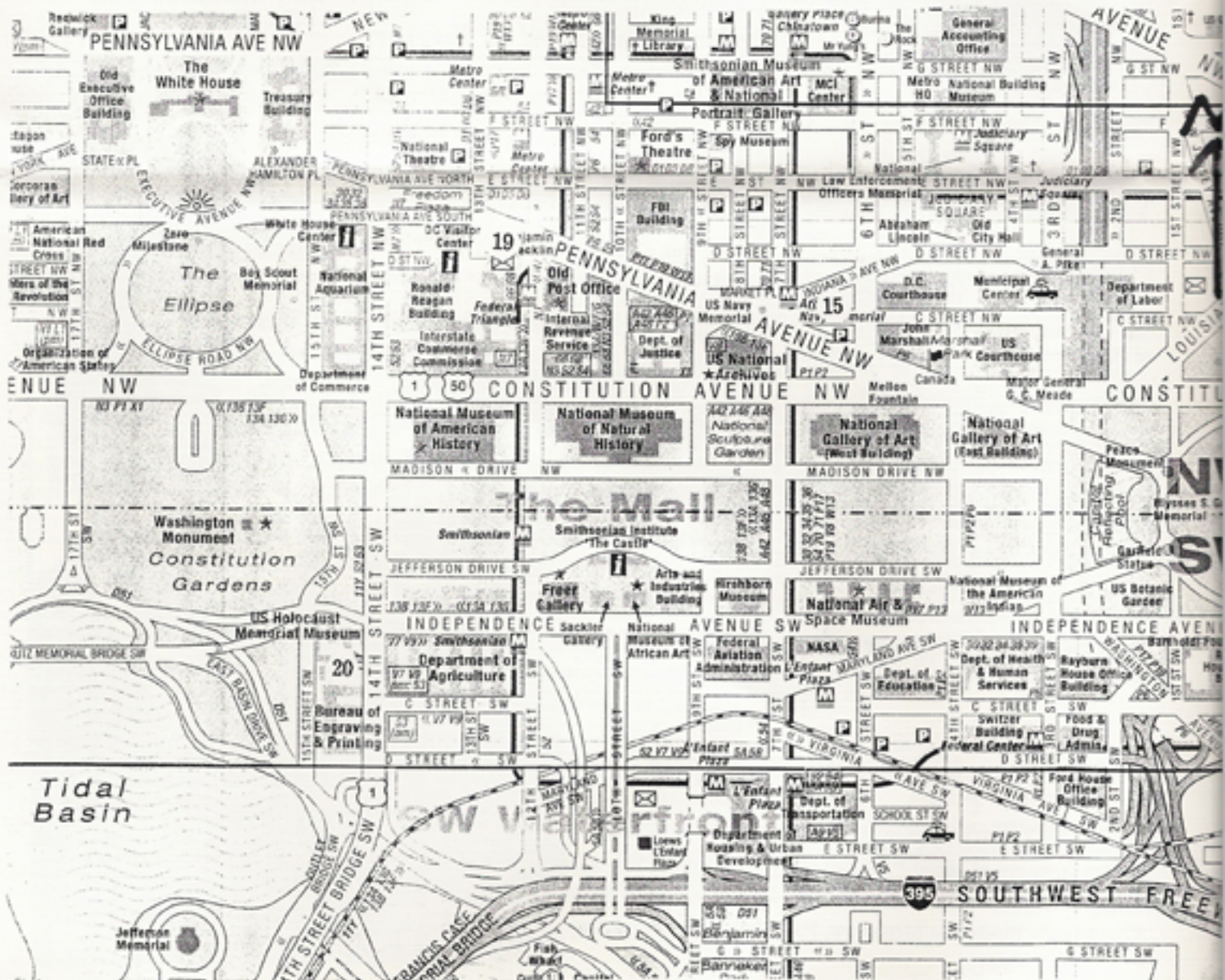

1. 311 East Capitol St. First evangelistic and "Back to the Bible" meetings in 1936. Beginnings of rooming house "tent-making." Dale Jr. discovered his mother and brother near death from carbon monoxide poisoning.

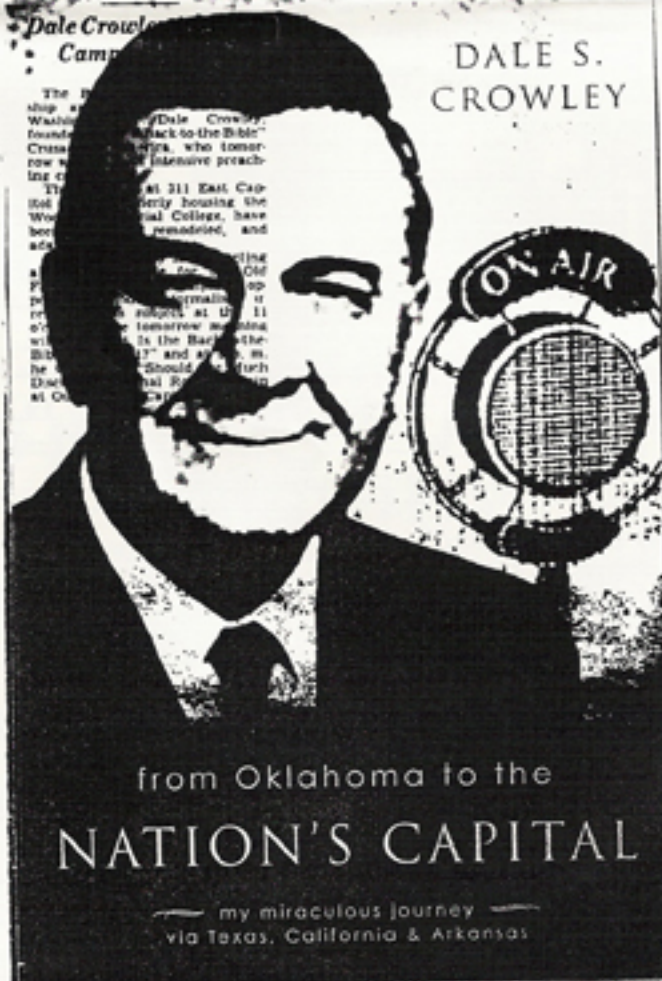
